The dreidel is a variant of the teetotum, a gambling toy found in many European cultures. Each side of the dreidel has a letter of the Hebrew alphabet: Nun ב Gimel ל Hey ה Shin ש which together form the abbreviation for Nes Gadol Hayah Sham היה לודג סנ which means "a great miracle happened there".
